## Course Overview

**Getting Started with BS31100 is designed to provide a one-day, introductory training session for risk managers and senior executives involved in risk management issues.**

## About BS31100

The British Standard 31100 – Code of Practice for Risk Management was launched in October 2008. Its objectives are to provide guidance on risk management best practice to companies of all sizes and from all industries. BS31100 is the basis for the proposed international risk management standard, ISO 31000, due out on 30 June 09.

BS31100 is designed to provide a basis for understanding, developing, implementing and maintaining risk management within any organisation in order to enhance an organisation's ability to achieve its objectives. This British Standard establishes the principles and terminology for risk management and gives recommendations for the model, framework, process and implementation of risk

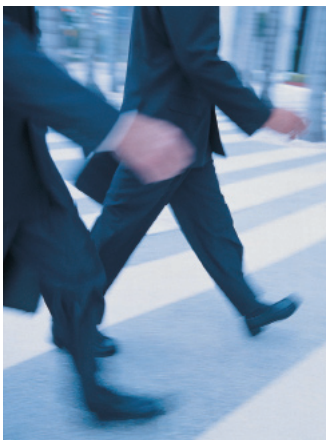

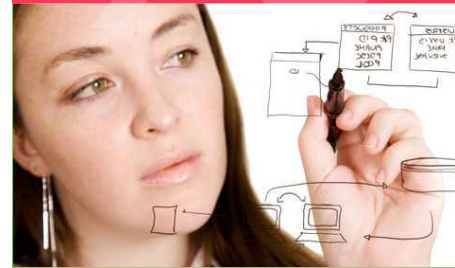
